B REPORTS

Nebraska Geological Society

The 2022 calendar is available as a gift with the donation to the NGS of fifteen dollars or more. It consists of images that inspired members to become geologists. Membership is down a bit, so NGS will test a hybrid meeting format in February with three in-person group locations – North Platte, Lincoln, and Omaha. NGS is still recruiting leaders and members for standing and ad-hoc committees.

C OLD BUSINESS

ASBOG 2021 Annual Meeting Update

Martin stated that the meeting was run very well, and was also well attended. The Executive Council voted without issues. Computer Based Testing (CBT) is moving ahead. The search for a CBT contractor was extensive, and there were webinars conducted to answer questions from the member boards. While not an easy transition, it will be beneficial in improving overall testing efficiency, and better accommodate examinees. Deferred applicants have until the October 2022 administration to take their exams, after which all fees will be forfeited in 2023.

ASBOG Fall COE Workshop Update

Joyce added that the selected CBT vendor also administers the ACT exam so there will be more testing centers around the country. Examinees no longer have to be in Nebraska to take the exam. The upcoming Council of Examiners (COE) workshops will be very robust. Approximately 60 geologists visited the Hot Springs National Park and the Crater of Diamonds on the field trip.

LB263 - Occupational Board Reform Act and Amendments

Copies of the Act were provided for review. The Act requires occupational boards to issue certain credentials based on credentials/work experience from another jurisdiction. Discussion was held

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regarding the difference between occupation and profession, non-ASBOG state specific licensing, FG and PG licensing language, the sixty-day stipulation, the health and safety requirement, and whether the Act applies to the board.

Transition to Computer Based Testing
